
Welcome

OBITUARY

Major John Tatham 26th April 1933-11th April 2024

We are very sad to report the passing of John, a valuable and loyal Trustee of The Royal Cambridge Home since 1995.

Prior to retiring and joining the board of Trustees, John served in the Army for 19 years, followed by 10 years in business and a further 13 years as the Estates Bursar at a school in Surrey. In 1992 he was invited to serve as a Captain of Invalids at The Royal Hospital Chelsea where he stayed for 12 years.

John joined the Home as a Trustee in 1995 and was an integral part of the charity, contributing to the key decisions that help with the day-to-day running of the home. In particular, his work in sourcing funding for our minibus. A regular visitor to the Home he would often arrive early to ensure he spoke to as many staff and residents as possible.

John was a true gentleman and his kindness and care shone through. He will be missed by us all.

John leaves behind his beloved wife Annie, a son, daughter and grandchildren.
